The current regime

- Aquaculture must take place within an Aquaculture Management Area (AMA)
- Invited private plan change (+ council initiated and private plan change)



Maori Aquaculture Settlement

- Maori Commercial Aquaculture Claims Settlement Act
- Pre-commencement space early settlement



What is the problem?

Since the aquaculture reforms of 2004

...not a single Aquaculture Management Area (AMA) has been applied for and not a single hectare of new aquaculture space has been created.
