KAIMOANA

- Collect information
 - Important iconic or taonga species
 - Important fishing grounds
 - Customary, commercial and recreational fishing
 - By FMA, QMA, Stat Area, fine scale info...
- Analyse information and develop options to assist in addressing problems
- Explore stakeholder agreements (pataka, mataitai)
- Input and participate in fisheries management
- Review and refine information system for effectiveness

Next steps

- Pilot implemented from 15 October 2009
- Conclude and review at 30 September 2010
- Aim is to jointly develop, refine and implement satisfactory long-term mechanism for all iwi and hapu
