STRATEGIC FOCUS AREAS AND KEY PERFORMANCE MEASURES FOR 1 OCTOBER 2006 - 30 SEPTEMBER 2007

Strategic Focus Area 1: Allocate and Transfer Fisheries Settlement Assets to Mandated Iwi Organisations

- At least 50 iwi have been recognised by the Te Ohu Kaimoana Board as a mandated iwi organisation.
- At least 40 % of coastline agreement assets have been transferred.
- Monitoring and reporting mechanisms in place to cover swaps and disposal of settlement quota.
- Quota swaps policy operational.

Strategic Focus Area 2: Protect the Value and Sustainability of the Fisheries Settlement Assets

- Advice developed by Te Ohu Kaimoana is supported by iwi and lodged with relevant agencies in a timely fashion.
- Fisheries management activities are demonstrably effective, as supported by iwi.
- Clear criteria and processes for Te Ohu Kaimoana's ongoing involvement with CSOs, established.

Strategic Focus Area 3: Manage Changes to Ensure the Te Ohu Group and Iwi Meet Future Challenges

- Individual iwi aware of the range of activities required of owners of fishing assets.
- Current and medium-term roles and responsibilities of Te Ohu Kaimoana and iwi, agreed in principle.
- Strategic planning process and timetable transparent across the Te Ohu Group.
- Policies for Te Ohu Kaimoana's governance and management of Wai Maori and Te Whakatupu completed.
- Strategic plans, annual plans and annual reports completed and distributed to iwi in the required timeframe.

Strategic Focus Area 4: Provide Optimal Governance of the Te Ohu Group

- Independent reporting by Te Ohu Kaimoana to iwi, on Aotearoa Fisheries Ltd's performance.
- Targets for shareholder value set and benchmarked.
- Governance, management and accountability boundaries agreed between Te Ohu Kaimoana Trustee Ltd and the Boards of Aotearoa Fisheries Ltd, Te Putea Whakatupu Trustee Ltd and Te Wai Maori Trustee Ltd.
