Relationship Between 'Maori' and Iwi Rights



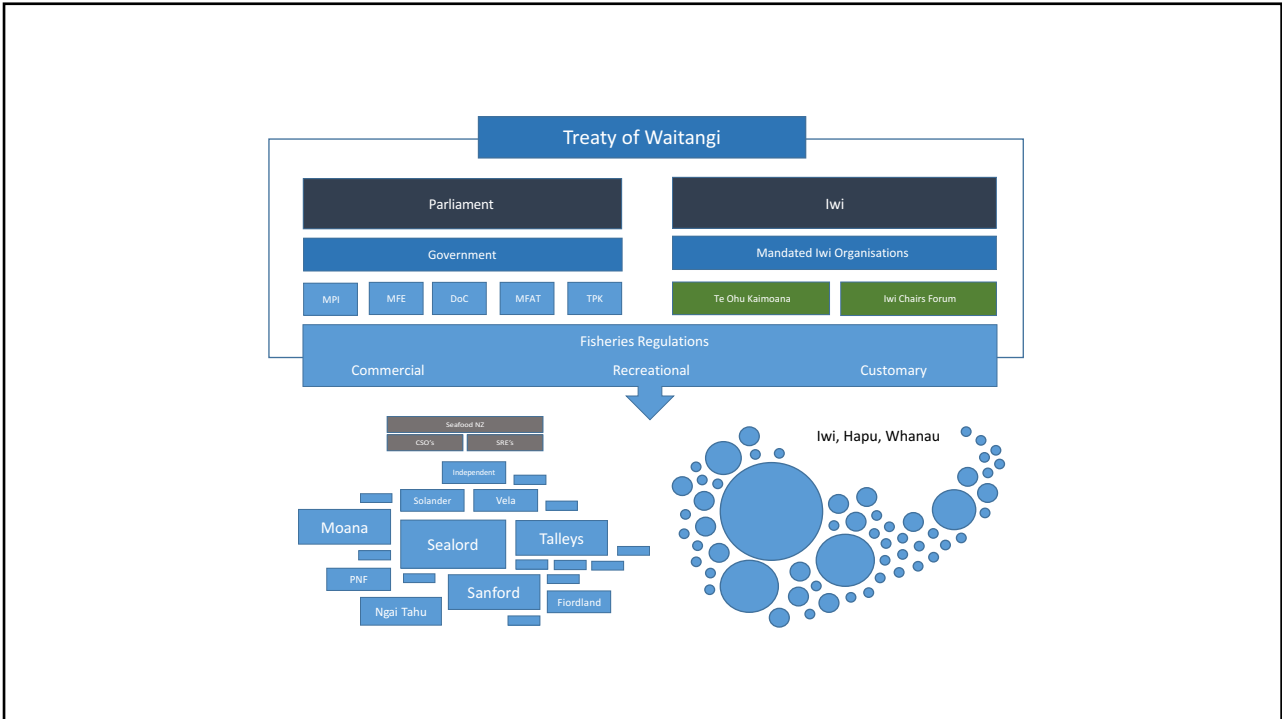


Maori Fisheries Strategy Vision

- The ongoing Treaty Partnership between Iwi and the Crown is given effect through development of fisheries-related legislation, policies and arrangements that recognise and respect the rangatiratanga of iwi over their traditional fisheries.

Key Strategies

1. Align competing Maori political and commercial structures as much as possible
2. Collectively reassert the Deed of Settlement as the basis of the Maori-Crown relationship in Fisheries
3. Develop fisheries leadership capable of balancing Maori and iwi perspectives
4. Proactively develop National and Regional fisheries policy based on Maori principles
